



GRETA HORT-DANNEBROG FOUNDATION SCHOLARSHIP – 2018 APPLICATION FORM

University College and the Dannebrog Foundation are offering two students from the University of Melbourne, the opportunity to go on exchange to Aarhus University, Denmark, in Semester 2, 2018. The scholarships are valued at \$9,000 each. One scholarship is set aside for an Arts student, and the other scholarship will be offered to a student of any course (including Arts).

All information provided will be treated with strict confidentiality. The scholarship application deadline for students who are applying for the Greta Hort-Dannebrog Foundation Scholarship at University College is Monday 16th October, 2017.

SCHOLARSHIP OBJECTIVES

The Greta Hort Dannebrog Scholarship wishes to support two University of Melbourne students to study in Denmark and to allow them to take full advantage of the academic opportunities offered at Aarhus University. In particular, this scholarship aims to support students who in normal circumstances are not able to afford to undertake exchange to Aarhus.

In addition it is intended that the experience will enable an Australian student to immerse themselves in the Danish language and provide them with unique opportunities to experience Danish life and culture.

EXPECTATIONS OF THE RECIPIENT

On return from the exchange the recipient would be required to:

- submit a report on the visit to University College and the Dannebrog Foundation and
- address the Danish Club/Dannebrog Foundation to provide feedback about the exchange experience and how you met the objectives of the scholarship.

Additionally, it is anticipated that the students would:

- maintain an active interest and connection to the Danish culture and life
- maintain an active interest and connection to University College
- promote better understanding and engagement by other Australians with Danish culture and life
- demonstrate increased competence in their area of academic interest

ASSISTANCE WITH DANISH LANGUAGE

To assist the students make the most of the experience the recipients will be provided with preliminary Danish language classes in Semester 1, 2018.

APPLICATION

A brief autobiography, describing:

- Your background
- Principal interests and activities, noting those in which you have held a leadership position.

A detailed statement of intent describing:

- Your proposed field of study and future career plans, including an explanation of how these plans will assist in achieving your career aspirations.
- What you hope to achieve and how this would match the objectives of the scholarship.

Please include a letter of support from two referees: one personal and one academic.
